Ellen (Nellie) went to Salisbury, Rhodesia and worked in some clerical/secretarial post. She drank! When she visited in Bucknell in the 1950s June kept finding her in the public bar at the Trigger Pond. Her lifelong hairstyle caused some amusement (door knockers). Margaret and Jessie were oppressively religious and strict (Episcopalians). They both smoked heavily. They were not very popular with the younger generations, especially Jessie, who had a facial hair problem. They did have a very hard life.

We were all very shocked to learn of the sudden death of Margaret M. Mutch, who with her sister lived together in Craigton Road. Never did a Sunday morning go by at 8.30 a.m. without Margaret Mutch and her sister being present, and on the two last Sundays before she died when she was unable to be in church for communion many of us felt that something had gone radically wrong. So that the service should be bright and full of resurrection joy, which expressed her nature and her faith, two vases of flowers were placed in church and left there over Passion Sunday. The Bishop came and helped with the service, a number of the congregation were able to join the family mourners, the music was bright and cheerful, and we all felt that this was what she would have liked. On the following day after the cremation her ashes were buried in our Garden of Remembrance. We will miss her very much, as will indeed her sister, but with those words of the commital ringing in our ears 'in sure and certain hope of the general resurrection in the last day and the life of the world to come .. ' we commend her soul into the keeping of Almighty God. May she rest in peace.
